**Facilities Rentals** - Contact the Manager to rent the ice and/or Club facilities. The Club can seat up to 100 people for your event. Additional facilities and a second kitchen and bar are available on the upper level for larger events. A variety of catering options are available.

Ice rentals start at \$50 a sheet, or \$125 for all 4 sheets for a 2-hour period.

Hall rentals available year- round.

**No smoking** - The Cornwall Curling Club is designated smoke-free. A smoking area is available outside the Club.

**Pro Shop** - a wide variety of curling equipment and crested clothing is available at our pro shop. Many items are stocked. Others may be ordered. See our Manager for more information.

**Brushes and footwear** - regular members are expected to use their own brushes and sliders. Club equipment is for ice rental and casual curlers only. Clean sneakers and slider, or curling shoes (no outside footwear) are to be used on the ice surface, in order to keep it clean.

**Ice surface** - curlers are requested not to put their bare hands on the ice surface when delivering rocks, as this causes “flat spots” in the ice. No food, or alcoholic beverages are permitted in the ice area.

**Practice** – All curling members are encouraged to use ice for practice whenever free ice is available. These times are booked in advance on a first-come basis.

**Volunteer duties** - Members are encouraged to help out with social and other events. Please contact a Board of Directors member if you can help out in any other way, as volunteer participation helps keep our membership dues low.

**Instruction** - Besides the free curling school at the beginning of each season, trained instructors will be giving instruction at various times during the season. Watch the activity board or website, or ask any Board member for more information. We also have qualified instructors available to give private or group lessons for a reasonable fee.

**Rules** – CCA rules, including the 4 rock free guardzone, will be in effect.

- Members and their invited guests are welcome to drop in at any time when the Club is open.

- When school is cancelled due to weather, Youth and Seniors curling is cancelled.

- New teams are made up every six weeks or so for evening individual entry draws. Draws are individual entry unless specified otherwise.

-Two hours are allotted for each 8 ends of play. If you start late, you are still expected to finish on time. A buzzer will sound when 15 minutes are left, and curlers must finish their end and leave the ice.

### **Curling Etiquette, Customs,Responsibilities**

- At the start and end of every game, players shake hands with the members of the opposing team.

- When a team delivers and sweeps their rock, sweepers from the opposite team stand between the hog lines and to one side

- Only skip and third are allowed in the house, except when sweeping into the house

- At our Club, the losing team sweeps the ice after the game

- After a game, winning players customarily buy a drink for the corresponding opposition player, and both teams sit at the same table

- Experienced curlers have a responsibility to help beginners understand and enjoy the game. They should also let the drawmaster know if there are any team problems, and help members find spares.

- If you are unable to curl on a given day, it is your responsibility to get a spare. If you can’t find one, please phone your skip. This is one of the most important responsibilities of a Club member, as nobody wants to forfeit a game because of too few players.
